of Mead, Washington. The Double E Ranch's Rifle Class wound up with Selina, Ohio cowboy Steve Wilson, with a winning time of 20.031 seconds, beat out his closest rival, Westhoff, Texas' Matt Sronce, who shot a 20.878 seconds—leaving just .847-second between the two times! The Wrangler Pro and the Colt Eliminator classes also saw the top shooters scrape by with the slightest of leads. In the Wrangler Pro, Maple Plain, Minnesota's Jessica Kuka led over Darby, Montana's Diane Holmes-Purcelli by just .175-second with a score of 16.580 over Purcelli's 16.755 score.

The hottest and closest race was the Colt Eliminator finals, held during the Saturday Night showcase, when Tammy Townsend of Darby, Montana, flamed through the “Wedge” (Course No. 24) with a world record breaking 11.833 seconds, awarding Tammy with a beautiful Colt Single Action Army revolver and top position, while sending Westhoff, Texas' Tammy Sronce, to the second place standing with her fast 12.369-second time. Only .536-second separated these two top cowgirls in this heated shootout. However, the Men's Colt Eliminator scored even tighter

scores when Roswell, New Mexico's Taylor Marley raced his horse across the finish line with a blazing 11.913-second time, winning a shiny new Colt Peacemaker. Galloping right behind Taylor's spurs was Sturgis, South Dakota's Jim Hanson, who came in just .173-second behind him with a 12.086 scoring!
